



29)INDIAN STUDENTS PARLIAMENT (BHARTIYA CHHATRA SANSAD) (19TH JANUARY -21ST JANUARY 2018)

31)SEVEN DAYS RESIDENTIAL CAMP(28TH JANUARY-3RD FEBRUARY 2018)

NSS unit of our college organized a seven days residential camp in the adopted village, Banubai Wadi,Tara gaon,Panvel from 28-01-2018 to 03-02-2018. The main project for this camp was based on, Swatch Bharat Abhiyaan.The Volunteers of the NSS unit performed many other activities – awareness programmes as literacy, tree plantation, health and hygiene, construction and repairs etc.It helped the volunteers to develop a sense of discipline and devotion .As the camp is an occasion for establishing rapport with the community. The objective of the programme was to involve the village population actively in rural welfare programmes and make them see that, by their own coordinated efforts, they could live a better life.

32)WASTE MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP (7TH-8TH FEBRUARY 2018)

This activity was organised by University of Mumbai NSS Cell in collaboration with Smt.K.G Mittal College of Arts and Commerce .Two volunteers from our unit actively participated in this two days workshop. While delivering lecture on the topic, the speaker highlighted the issue that solid waste should be segregated as being biodegradable and non-biodegradable and placed into separate dustbins. Moreover, he exhorted that what they refer to as waste is a resource if proper managed. He particularly emphasized that they should make compost for recycle of the organic resources. The main objective of this session was to Create Awareness to every citizen about Waste Management And Environment and to Reduce the carbon footprint of our cities and help in reducing green house gases. And making our cities an example in waste management to be followed by rest of the world. He concluded with an appeal that conserving the environment is the need of the hour and pathway for sustainable development

33)DISTRICT LEVEL DISASTER MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP (13TH FEBRUARY -14TH FEBRUARY 2018)

A two days workshop cum training programme on Disaster Management was held at R.D National College for volunteers of National Service Scheme (NSS). Two volunteers from our unit actively participated in this workshop. These session were focused on various aspects of disaster, Disaster Management Act, 2005, understanding of disaster management act for citizens of India, its awareness and importance, types of disasters [man made & natural], post disaster precaution and activities, importance of first aid, elements of first aid, use of first aid and benefits of carrying first kit during the travel, availability of first aid kit at home/workplace was also explained. Practical sessions were about - Do & Don'ts during and after the disaster, demonstration of different rescue tools, use of these tools in different types of disasters [like flood, fire, forest fire, land slide, accident etc.], were demonstrated with the help of student volunteers. A group of students trained for such emergency situation. Precautions to be taken in helping victims, procedures to be followed after the arrival of medical team, transportation of victim to nearby medical facility and safe areas, were explained and demonstrated with the help of presentation. Essential contents of a first aid kit, effective use of kit to reduce medical complications in different disaster situations were demonstrated.

34) UNIVERSITY LEVEL CAMP (15TH FEBRUARY TO 21ST FEBRUARY 2018)

One of our volunteer got selected for the University level camp jointly organised by University NSS Cell and Phanasgaon Arts and Commerce College,District-Sindhudurg at Pombhurle,Taluka-Devgad .10 volunteers from each District were selected on the basis of their personality, capability and positivity. The activity was inaugurated by Mr.Anurudra Narkar followed by the activities such as debates and discussion on topics such as corruption, personality development, social issues, etc.Several activities were undertaken by the volunteers in the course of camp .The main theme of the camp was Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan. It also had Shramdaan ,yoga and Guest lectures by various eminent personalities from the field of NSS. It helped the volunteers to acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude towards the society, develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and practise national integration and social harmony. The activities not only exposed the students to rural life, but also made a tangible impact in the lives of the villagers.

Coanseling was received with apositive response in the academic year 2017-18.



1. Title of the Practice : Social Outreach Programmes

2. Goal

The College looks at education differently. It consistently and constantly works to form the students as Competent, Committed, Creative and Compassionate human beings. Foundation courses and the Outreach programs make a difference in the lives of the students forming them socially conscious and responsible citizen of the country. The College believes in giving back to the community in whatever ways possible by them .Keeping these high morals and living up that verve, is what makes students at the College stand out and take up social initiatives. The National Social Scheme (NSS) unit of the college through its multifarious activities involves students in wide range of community service. The unit tries to sensitize the students towards the changing needs of the society

There is an increasing reluctance on the part of young college students to take social service seriously and even as a career. There is a need to remedy this imbalance. The objective is to try and remedy this situation by creating a framework that facilitates collaborative work involving the students and the faculty members. The economics of social work makes it unviable for students to embrace it as a full-time vocation. We strive to remove this block from the mind of the students and encourage them to become a citizen with humane approach towards the underprivileged section.

3. The Context

We believe in promoting a society which cares: cares to protect, preserve and conserve the marginalized and underprivileged section. Realizing the importance of holistic development many activities are undertaken to make the students sensitive to the issues. A plethora of events are organized each year to create awareness on campus, such as Tree Plantation, Awareness programmes on HIV/AIDS, Blood Donation Drives, Thalassemia Awareness Camps, NSS Rural Camps etc.

The college conducts regular extension activities and services so that education and research benefit society at large. National Service Scheme (NSS) volunteers actively participate in the extension activities of the college. Annual camps are held to sensitize students towards community development. Efforts are made to encourage students to engage with and contribute to the community through their college festivals. Participation in inter-collegiate events, seminars on environmental concerns, blood donation drives are held to promote holistic development of students.

Programmes such as Enactus, Share-a-smile are some of our flagship activities. Through Enactus students engaged with the koli community from Uran Manori Region have been helping them increase their business by marketing their products since last four years.

The BMS and BFM festivals begin with a social initiative called Share a Smile. Our students visit orphanages and old age homes and engage in fun activities with them. Understanding the lifestyle and trying to adjust 7 days with the minimum resources available leave a great impact on their lives of the students and teach them to be more adaptable, and sensitive to the needs of community in our country.

4. The Practice

The various programmes organised were:

> ESSAY WRITING

• This occasion was really pious, as the nation not only has to mark its gratitude to the great personality of Indian freedom struggle, but at the same time educate and update the new generation about him. Therefore an essay writing competition was held in the college where 24 volunteers participated.

> POSTER MAKING

• In order to spread the message of unity and commemorate the day with special programs the N.S.S unit organised a poster making competition where 15 volunteers participated. The posters highlighted the thoughts of Sardar Vallabhai Patel and the message he gave to the young generation.

> PLEDGE

• The day was marked by taking of pledge to uphold the nation's unity, integrity and security. The N.S.S volunteers took the pledge in the spirit of unification of our country which was made possible by the visions and actions of late Sardar Vallabhai Patel.

The N.S.S volunteers along with NHO Anti-Dowry Movement, spreaded awareness on this campaign, across Mumbai city. Around 10 colleges including our college participated in this rally. The rally started from Vile Parle's Suncity Cinema and concluded at Sathaye College. The rally highlighted the message to the women that "No one can come to your rescue. Only you can fight for your rights. Unless you stand up and fight against violence meted out to you, there will be no end to dowry deaths and rape cases".

> STREET PLAY AT BANDRA STATION

The NSS unit of Smt.M.M.K College, Bandra (west) performed a street play highlighting the topics Abortion,Gender Discrimination,Anti-Dowry and Organ Donation at Bandra West Railway Station. Where we got enthusiastic response, several passerbys stopped to be an audience to the play. During and after the play at several points the crowd got extremely engaged and on learning about our work, supported it wholeheartedly. People also asked us to perform these in their own residential localities as well, in order to spread the word.

> DISASTER MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP

Students from different colleges came together to learn more about disaster management at a two-day workshop held at KPB Hinduja College of Commerce.Total five N.S.S volunteers from our college participated in the workshop where the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation's disaster cell taught students about management of resources and responsibilities while dealing with emergencies. The session started with an oath and innaugral speech.The students were introduced to the various kinds of natural as well as man-made disasters. The students were made to practice risk management techniques in simulated environments. The session covered topics such as earthquake, flood, cyclone, fire, and stampede. It also focused on the rules of staying safe and the five points to remember during a disaster – do not panic; be calm, be cool; do not spread rumours and do not believe them; do not run, walk fast; and apply presence of mind.The workshop is timely, especially in a year when several citizens lost their lives to disasters such as the Elphinstone stampede and building collapse at Pakmodia street.

> ORPHANAGE ACTIVITY AT ST.CATHERINE'S OF SIENNA

A visit to an Orphanage is a life-changing experience as it is filled with emotions and sentiments. We were lucky to get an opportunity to visit an Orphanage named St.Catherine's of Sienna.There were craft and game activities arranged by some of the volunteers that created a fun atmosphere for volunteers and kids to mingle. There were drawing competitions, quiz competitions, short film presentations and dance as well as quality time between kids and the volunteers. The children showed a lot of generosity, sharing, caring and love towards one another and everyone around them. In addition, it was fun to interact with the kids and encourage them to maintain their health and hygiene.On the last day of this activity, we distributed gifts and snacks to the kids.

> <u>MUMBAI PEACE MARATHON (7TH JANUARY 2018)</u>

Our volunteers participated in Swami Vivekananda Jayanti (National Youth Day) & 125thAnniversary Year of Swami Vivekananda Chicago Speech Anniversary.It was held at Juhu.The marathon started at 7:00 am in the morning .Run for Vivekananda is an Awareness Run to Promote Swami Vivekananda Teachings in Masses, Specially Youths.The "Vivekananda Youth Connect" - initiative to popularise Swami Vivekananda's message to the youth and project him for what he is, a youth icon.There was 12 Km Vivekananda Honour Run,5 Km Vivekananda Dream Run,2km Walk Vivekananda Awareness Walk.

> UNITED FOR ROAD SAFETY (16th JANUARY 2018)

They also introduced to us the MTP app which is made for the betterment of the pedestrians and their safety. We were shown a slideshow regarding the information about the Road Safety Programme. They concluded the day by telling us how to take safety measures.

> INDIAN STUDENTS PARLIAMENT (BHARTIYA CHHATRA SANSAD)

Two of our volunteers participated in this activity which was held at MIT Campus,Pune .The innovative platform Bharatiya Chhatra Sansad or BCS as it is known as, is a non-political platform to sensitize the power of youth. It is in a way a classroom that provides political coaching to nearly 10,000 students in the age group of 18-25.It provides lessons on the functioning of a democracy and encourages the students to serve the society by entering public life and assuming leadership roles. It is aimed at enhancing the roles and relevance of youth in democratic institutions like political parties, social organizations, colleges, universities and Public institutions.A number of political leaders, industrial leaders and youth icons of national and international eminence, from all walks of life provide them the context, analysis, courage, insight and perspective so that they can dream bigger, see clearer and speak

louder. They raised their consciousness and intellect, so that the youth have an opinion, a point of view and most importantly, a sobering thought about - what they will do to make a difference in the nation's life.

> <u>REPUBLIC DAY(26TH JANUARY 2018)</u>

> <u>SEVEN DAYS RESIDENTIAL CAMP(28TH JANUARY-3RD FEBRUARY 2018)</u>

NSS unit of our college organized a seven days residential camp in the adopted village, Banubai Wadi, Tara gaon, Panvel from 28-01-2018 to 03-02-2018. The main project for this camp was based on, Swatch Bharat Abhiyaan. The Volunteers of the NSS unit performed many other activities – awareness programmes as literacy, tree plantation, health and hygiene, construction and repairs etc. It helped the volunteers to develop a sense of discipline and devotion .As the camp is an occasion for establishing rapport with the community. The objective of the programme was to involve the village population actively in rural welfare programmes and make them see that, by their own coordinated efforts, they could live a better life.

> WASTE MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP (7TH-8TH FEBRUARY 2018)

This activity was organised by University of Mumbai NSS Cell in collaboration with Smt.K.G Mittal College of Arts and Commerce .Two volunteers from our unit actively participated in this two days workshop.While delivering lecture on the topic, the speaker highlighted the issue that solid waste should be segregated as being biodegradable and non-biodegradable and placed into separate dustbins. Moreover, he exhorted that what they refer to as waste is a resource if proper managed. He particularly emphasized that they should make compost for recycle of the organic resources.The main objective of this session was to Create Awareness to every citizen about Waste Management And Environment and to Reduce the carbon footprint of our cities and help in reducing green house gases.And making our cities an example in waste management to be followed by rest of the world.He concluded with an appeal that conserving the environment is the need of the hour and pathway for sustainable development

> DISTRICT LEVEL DISASTER MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP

A two days workshop cum training programme on Disaster Management was held at R.D National College for volunteers of National Service Scheme (NSS).Two volunteers from our unit actively participated in this workshop. These session were focused on various aspects of disaster, Disaster Management Act,2005, understanding of disaster management act for citizens of India, its awareness and importance, types of disasters [man made & natural], post disaster precaution and activities, importance of first aid, elements of first aid, use of first aid and benefits of carrying first kit

during the travel, availability of first aid kit at home/workplace was also explained. Practical sessions were about - Do & Don'ts during and after the disaster, demonstration of different rescue tools, use of these tools in different types of disasters [like flood, fire, forest fire, land slide, accident etc.], were demonstrated with the help of student volunteers. A group of students trained for such emergency situation. Precautions to be taken in helping victims, procedures to be followed after the arrival of medical team, transportation of victim to nearby medical facility and safe areas, were explained and demonstrated with the help of presentation. Essential contents of a first aid kit, effective use of kit to reduce medical complications in different disaster situations were demonstrated.

> <u>UNIVERSITY LEVEL CAMP (15TH FEBRUARY TO 21ST FEBRUARY 2018)</u>

One of our volunteer got selected for the University level camp jointly organised by University NSS Cell and Phanasgaon Arts and Commerce College,District-Sindhudurg at Pombhurle,Taluka-Devgad .10 volunteers from each District were selected on the basis of their personality,capability and positivity.The activity was innaugrated by Mr.Anurudra Narkar followed by the activities such as debates and discussion on topics such as corruption,personality development,social issues, etc.Several activities were undertaken by the volunteers in the course of camp .The main theme of the camp was Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan. It also had Shramdaan ,yoga and Guest lectures by various eminent personalities from the field of NSS.It helped the volunteers to acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude towards the society,develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and practise national integration and social harmony. The activities not only exposed the students to rural life,but also made a tangible impact in the lives of the villagers. **Enactus** (Entrepreneurs in Action) formerly known as SIFE (Students in Free Enterprise) is an international non-profit organization that brings together student, academic and business leaders who are committed to using the power of entrepreneurial action to improve the quality of life and standard of living for people in need. It operates in over 39 countries. It was launched in India in the year 2003. It is an innovative educational programme designed to channelize the idealism of university students into a meaningful community focused learning experience. The College has been a part of this organization since the past six years. We have come up with sustainable livelihood programs some of which greatly impacted the lives of the marginalized

Since its inception, Enactus MMK has contributed to the community through various projects like 'Futile to Fertile', 'Financial Literacy – the 4th R of Literacy' and 'Hope Interwoven'. These projects have challenged us and enabled us to evolve into a team with a common purpose.

Through our project "Hope Interwoven", we strive for the development of visually and physically challenged youth, women and deprived sections in the rural areas. With this in mind, we have tied up with the Grameen Shrameek Pratishthan (G.S.P.). This is a non- profit organization working in Latur since 1986. It aims at providing Sustainable Development to the disadvantaged section. It provides training to the visually impaired in handloom making

BBI Co-ordinator in association with an NGO- USD, started a Social Initiative where on Tuesdays and Thursdays students visit Carter Road and teach street children subjects such as History, Mathematics, English etc. It was a wonderful experience of returning back to the society as a part of social responsibility.

The Nature Club-

. With the horizon of time our Nature Club has changed the scope of work and broaden towards community welfare rather than just stick to nature and Environment.

It is about development of holistic skills among students by creating awareness and sensitizing towards different colors of life.

Hence this time under **Field Visit Programmes** with the BBI students's feelings of Patriotism, Pride on nation was aimed by our memorable visit to Jalianwala Baug & Wagha Border on 26th January, 2018. The entire visit evoked feelings of devotion and respect towards the nation among students. The 26th January 2018 Parade Day Programme has imparted life skill training to the students.

5. Evidence of Success

The college NSS unit has to give detailed reports on the NSS activities every year to the University Department of Student Welfare. The Unit has self motivated volunteers who actively participate in different activities and both male and female volunteers are involved in community development process.

Since the extension activities are organized through NSS or individual departments, the participation of the students can be easily monitored. Activities such as cleanliness drive (Swach Bharat Campaign), street plays, residential camps, blood donation drives, peace rallies etc. ensure their presence and involvement right from the inception to the execution stage.

These activities have ensured the holistic development of the students. They emerge as wellrounded personalities, who have learnt skills like team building, management, leadership, etc. They also understand their responsibilities as citizen of the country.

The college encourages students to take part in NSS activities. Creating awareness among the students by announcements on the college website, notices circulated in class rooms and displayed on notice board and the faculty inform the students-are some ways through which the college promotes the participation of students in extension activities.

The teachers and students who participate in extension activities are granted duty leave and attendance. Marks are awarded to the students for participating in extension activities. The faculty members perform their role as conveners of committees through which these activities are organized.

Slum adoption programme, rural campaigns, entertainment programmes for orphanages and peace walks are activities which are held consistently by the college through NSS and individual departments. They are initiated in order to enhance a sense of social responsibility among students.

Participation of the beneficiaries in community engagement initiatives of the college is promoted with the help of meetings held in advance. In the case of student projects, door to door contact and canvassing is done. Street plays are yet another medium through which community involvement is solicited. Workshops are held in municipal schools. Differently – abled students from *Akansha Foundation* were invited to perform in the cultural program of the college, thereby providing them with an opportunity to present their talent to a large audience.

The college has a long association with J.B. Petit Municipal school. The students of the municipal school are provided with stationery and workshops are held with them for teaching them life skills. Differently – abled students from *Akansha Foundation* were invited to perform in the cultural program of the college, thereby providing them with an opportunity to present their talent to a large audience. The BMS and BFM festival begin with a social initiative called Share a Smile. Our students visit orphanages and old age homes and engage in fun activities with them.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Students do not show interest in these activities. They have to be motivated. There is an increasing reluctance on the part of young college students to take social service seriously and even as a career. There is a need to remedy this imbalance. The challenge is of managing membership of students with different time tables and individual constrain. Since extension activities demand much time of students, academically inclined students generally avoid participation in such activities. Arranging funds for these activities is a real challenge. The college has to generate funds from its own resources and even management provides funds for encouraging community development programme.
