

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

We are constantly evolving and impacting the lives of young students in a positive way by offering variety of activities and skill-based courses along with traditional courses. Even during these trying pandemic times when the world has been battling the Covid 19 crisis, the college has paid salaries to staff on time; all the examinations have been conducted in a timely manner. We have adapted to the new circumstances; our resilience increases as we recognize the magnitude of what we have already accomplished.

IQAC



REPORTS

Department of Business Economics

Ph.D. DEGREE AWARDED:

A total of 27 participants completed the course and had their origins from throughout the country. A Letter of Appreciation was received from Dr. K. Shanti, Director, UGC-HRDC University of Mumbai praising Dr. Manikandan lyer for successfully coordinating STC. At the end of the STC, the college came out with a Flip Book disclosing the events with write-ups for each day of the short-term course.
- 2) As a part of the Faculty Development Programme Committee and One Day, FDP was organized on Stress Management in Collaboration with ISME on Wednesday, 21st April 2021 for the degree college teachers of our college. The session was conducted by Ms. Anjana Vinod a famous Image consultant and Corporate Trainer. The session was attended by all the faculty of our college and was tremendously useful during these pandemic times.

The Department of Business Economics organised and co-ordinated with The Goods and Services Tax Practitioners Association of Maharashtra (GSTPAM) Certificate Course in Goods and Services Tax (CCGST) from 14th May 2021 to 13th June 2021 virtually on Google Platform. 25 Technical sessions were conducted by reputed industrial experts on a wide variety of topics covering the theme of the Certificate course. A total of 93 participants registered for the course. 64 students qualified the minimum criteria for attendance and were allowed to appear for the online examination which was held on Sunday, 27th June 2021. Seven students remained absent and 57 students appeared the online examination. 52 students successfully cleared the online examination (passing percentage of 91.22%) and were awarded E-Certificates. ORIENTATION MEET



This time we conducted an ONLINE Orientation Meet for 3 days from 12th Oct to 14th Oct. with a difference in format.



BACHELOR IN VOCATIONAL COURSES

The University Grants Commission has launched a scheme of B.Voc. Degree programme to expand the scope of vocational education and also to provide vertical mobility to the students admitted into the Universities and Colleges. This programme is focused on universities and colleges providing undergraduate studies which would also incorporate specific job roles along with broad based general education. This would enable the graduates completing B.Voc. to make a meaningful participation in accelerating India's economy by gaining appropriate employment, becoming entrepreneurs and creating appropriate knowledge. Accordingly, 'Deen Dayal Upadhyay Centres for Knowledge Acquisition and Upgradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood (KAUSHAL)' was also incorporated. Since all these three provisions serve a common purpose, all these schemes are merged into a single scheme for providing skill based education under National Qualification Framework.

The National Qualification Framework scheme intends to provide skills development based higher education as part of college or university education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) Degree with multiple exit options such as Diploma or Advanced Diploma.

Smt.MMK College was granted Four BVOC programs in Wealth Management, Media Communication and Journalism, E-commerce and Digital Marketing and Accounting and Taxation in this academic year. Students who have passed 12th class are eligible to pursue this course.

These courses offer multiple options like -

- Diploma certificate after completing 1 year
- Advanced Diploma certificate after completing 2 years
- Bachelor's Degree after completing 3 years

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE B.VOC. COURSE:

The Program allows the learner the following:

- Mobility between vocational and general education by alignment of degrees with NSQF.
- Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL), allowing transition from non-formal to organized job market.
- Standardized, consistent, nationally acceptable outcomes of training across the country through a national quality assurance framework.
- Global mobility of skilled workforce from India, through international equivalence of NSQF.
- Mapping of progression pathways within sectors and cross-sectorally.
- Approval of NOS/QPs as national standards for skill training.
- Projects, case studies, presentations, moot courts, mock stock and industrial visits ensure a good blend of theory and practical in the course.

B.VOC. IN MEDIA, COMMUNICATION AND JOURNALISM:

This program deals with domains like Media, Communication and journalism. B.Voc. Media, Communication and Journalism will train students in different areas of media, mass communication and journalism. The academic program is 3 years long.

B. VOC. IN E-COMMERCE AND DIGITAL MARKETING:

The term Electronic commerce (or E-Commerce) refers to the use of an electronic medium to carry out commercial transactions. Digital marketing for ecommerce businesses is extremely effective to catch attention and convert prospects to customers. With a combination of various tools and strategies, you

can attract prospective customers. It includes E-mail Marketing, Facebook Marketing, Twitter Marketing, YouTube Marketing, Quora Marketing, PPC, AdSense Marketing, Mobile Marketing, etc. So, Digital Commerce is very significant and is the need of the hour for both customers and businesses. Creating a consistent customer experience across all touchpoints and understanding and remembering a customer's interactions across those touch points remains significant for all types of businesses. B.Voc. E-Commerce and Digital Marketing will train students in different areas of Commerce, Marketing, Management, Information and Communication Technology.

The academic program is 3 years long.

B.VOC. IN ACCOUNTING AND TAXATION:


The B.Voc programme is focused on universities and colleges providing undergraduate studies which would also incorporate specific job roles along with broad based general education. This would enable the graduates completing B.Voc to make a meaningful participation in accelerating India's economy by gaining appropriate employment, becoming entrepreneurs and creating appropriate knowledge.

B.VOC. IN WEALTH MANAGEMENT

The B. Voc. in Wealth Management is a three year full time undergraduate program spread across six semesters, an ideal mix of general education and skill development components. Skill components of the courses have a minimum of 60% of the total credits and may go up to a maximum of 70% of the total credits, and the balanced credits shall be of general education component.

Objective



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IQAC REPORT 2020-21

In the last one year, we have all been passing through one of the most challenging phases in history. This unexpected pandemic turned our routine lifestyle completely upside down. Yet, as educational institutions, we were able to achieve many milestones and cross over many hurdles to set up new benchmarks towards quality improvement and sustenance in the management of institutions and in the fields of teaching and learning. During this lockdown period, a number of collaborative activities were organized among the sister institutions of the HSNC board. A very significant move is that we had many webinars, tie ups and FDPs where we could get together like never before, and organise activities which could benefit each other, the students, teachers and admin staff of our colleges.

Moment of Calm:-

The Department of Sindhi and NSS along with IQAC organised a program "Ruh Rihyan" to commemorate the birth anniversary of Dada J.P.Vaswani. The programme was aimed to celebrate the Moment of Calm on 2nd Aug 2020 at 5 pm in an online mode. The program was followed by Behrana Saheb from 6 pm to 8 pm .

The college also registered with Coursera to equip students and teachers with new skill courses which was very beneficial for them. Online placement drives were initiated. E-prospectus, E-magazine, E-library magazine were the other initiatives started during this period. Funkiria, Enthusia, Karavaan and such cultural events went online. Examinations were conducted with help from Mastersoft and Eklavya, using online mode. New vocational courses were started. It was an uphill task, but the changes took place slowly and steadily.

One day webinar On Institutional quality management (NAAC preparation strategy):-

This webinar was jointly organized by RUSA, Maharashtra and HSNC University and hosted by IQAC HR college of Commerce and IQAC Smt. MMK College of Commerce and Economics on 27th November 2020.

This was the first major programme which was organized by the HSNC University after its inception. This webinar witnessed participation of more than 400 delegates from various college in India and abroad.

The webinar was organized on the zoom platform from 9.30 am to 2pm. It was held under the guidance of Dr. Vijay Joshi, Chief consultant at RUSA and Dr. Pramod N. Pabrekar, Senior consultant at RUSA.

Welcome speech was given by Dr. Pooja Ramchandani, I/C Principal, HR College. She spelt the objective of the webinar which was aimed at setting institutional standards for obtaining higher grade at NAAC.

President of HSNC Board, Mr. Kishu Mansukhani enumerated the objectives of setting up HSNC University which is to align with the needs of the industry. As part of this, new courses with emphasis on Yoga and other vocational courses have been started by various institutions under HSNC Board.

Mr. Vijay Joshi, the Chief consultant at RUSA, spoke about the responsibility of being the first cluster university in the country and importance of being a trendsetter in the field of education. To change the world, we need to change the academic world, he emphasized. He spoke about the need for establishing certain checks and balances for ensuring quality in education, for rewarding excellence and for imbibing quality culture in education. Dr. Joshi called for a revolution in the field of Higher Education, which required new experimentation in the field of education. To achieve this, we must move from Best practices to Next practices, he said.

Dr. CA. Niranjan Hiranandani, Provost, HSNC university, emphasized on the need for bringing about paradigm change in education, about the importance of devising the contents of syllabus to align with the requirements of industry. He inspired teachers to be gurus and strive to make our nation the education center of the world just as it is considered to be the hub for Information Technology.

The first technical session was by professor, Dr. Vani Laturkar. She focused on the new rules for NAAC parameters and how to inculcate quality systems in institutions. She explained the vision for the NAAC process in terms of quality enhancement, self-evaluation, sustenance, initiation and promoting culture of quality enhancement. It is necessary for an institution to get accreditation under NAAC for its survival and growth, for obtaining various grants, for starting new courses and programmes, for obtaining autonomous status. The process of NAAC has undergone change as the emphasis has shifted from subjective to objective, offline to online, qualitative to quantitative, college centric to student centric, ICT based functioning and system generated scores. The new concept of third-party validation of data, system generated scores, importance of Student Satisfaction Survey (SSR) was explained by her. The emphasis now, is on Stakeholders' requirement and satisfaction, she said. The process of accreditation along with

key indicators, strictures relating to data deviations, criteria wise weightages were explained by Dr. Vani in great detail.

Dr. Bhole conducted the second technical session on the role of IQAC in the assessment and accreditation process. IQAC is termed as the Think tank as it focuses on areas that need attention and impact assessment. The role of IQAC in developing quality systems, quality enhancement and quality sustenance was explained by him. Importance of preparing a perspective plan for the next 5 to 10 years as part of goal setting initiative, conveying it to all stakeholders, developing systems for self-assessment involving feedback and SSR was dealt in detail. Are we considering our students as products or as customers? He challenged the teachers to start thinking from a new perspective.

As part of setting benchmarks, key performance indicators are to be identified. Decisions as to what to benchmark, who to bench mark, collection and analysis of data, gap analysis and gap filling are an important part of the role and responsibilities of IQAC. Sir also explained the practical difficulties in implementing ideas and the need to overcome them.

The third technical session on Documentation for NAAC was conducted by Prof. C.N. Raval. He focused on what is new in documentation. He explained that the principles of documentation are authenticity, objectivity, transparency, accountability, validity and credibility of data. He enumerated on the mode in which documents are to be submitted. He explained about data which is readily available and data which is to be created. Lastly, he explained about each and every document that is required to be uploaded criteria-wise. Since 70% is based on data provided and 30 % on Student Satisfaction Surveys, it is extremely important to develop the quality culture of our institutions, he said.

As part of the conclusion of the webinar, question and answer session was moderated by the Vice principal of Smt. MMK College, Mr. Mani lyer, the IQAC Coordinator Ms. Chippy Bobby was the rapporteur and gave the overview of the entire session.

The Vice Chancellor, Principal Dinesh Panjwani applauded the initiative taken by HR College and Smt. MMK College conducted the webinar and committed the willingness of the HSNC board to associate with programmes involving improvement of quality standards in educational institutions.

The webinar was concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. CA. Kishore S. Peshori, I/C Principal, Smt. MMK College of Commerce and Economics. In all, the seminar was a very fruitful and engaging one, with the Resource persons providing very vital and valid information in order to improve the quality of Management of our educational institutions and to maintain them according to the new parameters set by NAAC.

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME ON "THE 2C'S FOR TRANSFORMATIONAL LEARNING"

The FDP was conducted by the Bombay Teachers' Training College in association with three other institutions under HSNC Board such as H. and G.H.Mansukhani Institute of Management, Dr. L.H.Hiranandani College of Pharmacy and Smt. M.M.K. College of Commerce and Economics on 19th March 2021. The FDP was conducted online for the benefit of the faculty and students of these four institutes. The 2 C's in the programme refers to Collaborative and Constructionist approach to learning.

The Introduction session consisted of the welcome address by dignitaries. Dr. Swati Sabale enumerated the importance of the theme of the conference. Dr. Parag took us through the journey of online methodologies and ideas adopted by the HSNC Board colleges during lockdown and spoke about the importance of decreasing the gap in absorption of knowledge by the students'. Dr. Kishore Peshori observed that digitization and disruption due to covid led to globalization of education. He underlined the importance of reimagining our paradigm in the education sector and trying to reinvent oneself as a teacher.

The first session started with Dr. Bhagwan Balani, Principal of the host college and Dean, HSNC University, explained the purpose of collaboration as the ability to learn from one another and identify potential learning destinations. He underlined the importance of outcome based education as the need of the hour as learning would be optimum. He gave examples of collaboration at various levels in the industry and enumerated its importance in the field of education. He enumerated the principles of collaborative learning.

The second speaker Dr. Lubna Mansuri explained cooperative learning strategies as Jigsaw, Think-Pair-Share, Circle-the-Stage and Agree-Disagree Line-ups. In the learning pyramid model, lecture is least effective and teaching others as a process of learning is most effective, followed by practice by doing, group discussion, demonstration, etc. Engagement, exploration, transformation, presentation, reflection contributes most effectively to learning. She explained the concept of JIGSAW learning as research based cooperative learning. Participants were made into groups and practically experienced JIGSAW based learning techniques.

The third speaker of the morning session Dr. Priya Pillai, gave a practical session on the second strategy of cooperative learning, Think-Pair-Share strategy as part of creating a personalized learning environment in the classroom. Under this, the teacher poses a question, observation or challenge. Students are required to think and write out answers individually. They then pair up and combine their best answers. They share their ideas and learn about the ideas of others. This contributes to collaborative learning.

The morning session ended with a vote of thanks by Ms. Dyan Gonsalves. The programme was attended by around 60 faculty members and students. The techniques of collaborative learning can be used in making classroom teaching more engaging for the students.

Dr. Neelu Verma started the afternoon session with her class on constructivist pedagogy. She explained that constructivism is not one theory but a coming together of many instructional approaches.

In this new paradigm of pedagogy, we believe that a student instead of being taught by the teacher, the teacher becomes a facilitator to find out things within him. The purpose of this approach is to ignite the passion and curiosity in the student.

Dr. Neelu elucidated further that the following things should happen in a constructivist classroom - Inquiry, Action, Imagination, Invention, and Interaction, Hypothesizing and personal reflection.

She also discussed various strategies for instruction and learning. Through the 7Es model, it was possible to develop Higher Order Thinking Skills among our students. The 7Es are Elicit, Engage, Explore, Explain, Elaborate, Evaluate and Extend.

Dr. Raju Talreja took up the last session on SQ3R strategy. She spoke about various strategies to achieve higher order thinking skills.

Dr. Talreja highlighted the importance of the SQ3R strategy – Survey, Query, Read, Recall and Review, which is totally student focused. According to her, these techniques are very effective because these help the learners take responsibility for their own learning. We as teachers empower them to take up this onus, which is very important in these challenging times.

All the sessions were highly interactive with the participants going into many break out room sessions and also giving answers through the chat box and other technical methods.

It was a very well organised FDP where the participants were kept constantly engaged as they learnt the various concepts of collaborative learning. The need to construct and collaborate knowledge together as emphasised by Dr. Balani, truly bore fruit in the form of this FDP, as the four sister institutions came together to engage in a time of exploration, reflection and practical learning.

IQAC coordinator attended a webinar on Digital World of Education and Communication on June 23, 2020 conducted by U.S. Consulate General, Mumbai.

Webinar on Virtually Engaging Learning Activities - 30th October 2020 -

This webinar was attended by three of our IQAC members Ms, Chippy Susan Bobby, Dr. Meena k. and Mr. Sushant Damodare, as it was a holiday and our Principal encouraged us to take part in some interesting learning experience. It was organized by the Bombay Management Association and the duration was from 4-6 pm. 27 participants including the organisers attended the webinar.

The session started with the welcome note by Prof. RSS Mani, ITM, BMA President. The two trainers who engaged the participants for the next two hours, then took over.Mr. Shyam lyer and Ms. Kala Divanji. It was a unique learning experience with a fine blend of practical learning and fun through various activities.

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME ON 9th April 2021:-

:- This programme was organized by Western Regional Council of ICAI jointly with HSNC University, BOS Accountancy, Mumbai University, Indian Accounting Association, Thane Branch, Joshi Bedekar College, Thane and Smt. Mithibai Motiram Kundnani College.

This programme started with the inaugural address by the Chairman, ICAI Mr. Manish Gadia. He reiterated support for commerce students with the launch of programme "Earning while Learning". Dr. Arvind Luhar, Chairman, Board of Studies in Accountancy, University of Mumbai spoke about the need for collaboration with the CA institute in identifying potential areas of research in the field of accountancy, in framing career-oriented courses and syllabus for the betterment of students.

The keynote address was delivered by CA Jay Chhaira, ICAI, who informed that ICAI started virtual classes for its students during the pandemic and connected 3 lakh students through virtual platform. He touched upon the need for providing industrial training, scholarships to potential CA students so as to make the course affordable, starting multiple programmes on skill development.

Dr. Suchitra Naik, Principal of Joshi Bedekar College, outlined the vision of FDP. She expressed the view that proficiency and skill development has to go hand in hand with ethical principles and practices.

The first speaker CA Atul Suraiya, a senior tax professional with over 35 years' experience conducted the session on recent amendments under Direct Tax Laws. The second session was conducted by CA Dhruvank Parikh on Indirect Tax laws.

The programme concluded with a formal Vote of Thanks by Principal, DR. CA. Kishore S. Peshori, Smt. MMK College of Commerce and Economics.

FDP on Stress Management on 21st April 2021:-

Although it was a holiday, Our staff members gathered together for this programme, which , we felt , was the need of the hour, as we were going through this difficult time together. This was organized by ISME and MMK college together for the benefit of our faculty. Ms. Anjana Vinod, image consultant and corporate trainer, conducted the session for us.

She taught us the importance of valuing ourselves and the need for self introspection and self awareness. To alleviate stress, we need to find a good support system, do simple meditation and breathing exercises and adopt a change in attitude. She also emphasized on the importance of simple physical exercises and laughter in our daily lives.

Short Term Course:-

The Short term Course on Financial and Investment Planning under RUSA, was organised by UGC Human Resource Development (HRDC), University of Mumbai and coordinated by Smt. Mithibai Motiram Kundnani College of Commerce and Economics from 19th April 2021 to 24th April 2021.

Dr. Manikandan Iyer, Joint Co-ordinator of STC, gave a brief note on the objectives of the course. Dr. Hiranandani, Provost, HSNC University, interacted with the participants and discussed the need for Financial and Investment Planning.

LIBRARY

We are going through a phase when the need for a digital library is very essential. I am glad to inform you that our college library has decided to take up that challenge and move forward. We bought the dcoll (Digital Collection) module of the library software SLIM21 as its first step during this academic year and digital collection development is in progress. The users can search Library OPAC through the college website and can access its e-resources.

The college library has a rich collection of more than 51000 books on a range of subjects. We have added 227 new books costing Rs.64,731/- in its collection during the current year. The library subscribes to 58 periodicals including e- journals. In addition to this, the library subscribes to NLIST from INFLIBNET which allows access to more than 6000 e-journals and 1,64,300 eBooks under NLIST and 6,00,000 eBooks through NDL.

The library provides Book Bank facility to underprivileged B.COM students. We have added 364 new textbooks costing Rs.45,289/- to the existing book bank collection. In the current academic year 114 students have availed of the facility.

The Library orientation was conducted online for students of various courses in this academic year. The College Library has institutional membership of Bombay Management Association and Dosti House (American Library).

An online demonstration of Library Management System by Sheth Publishers was conducted on 18th Sept. 2020 for Degree and Junior college teaching faculty. E-textbooks published by them were given to teachers free of charge.

The Library arranged an online demonstration of dColl and Online Registration Module of Library Software for the teaching faculty of Degree College and Junior college on 20th October 2020 prior to its purchase. The purpose of this demonstration was to obtain the valid suggestions from the teaching faculty.

A session on Introduction to Library OPAC and dColl was held on 1st March 2021 for Degree college faculty on MS Team by the Librarian. The purpose of this session was to introduce the new features of the library OPAC and to train the teachers to use it without hesitation.

The second issue of Library eBulletin was published in October 2020. This issue contains the links to study materials and course readings freely available online for various courses. While selecting course readings, utmost care has been taken to include reference books that have been listed in the syllabi of University of Mumbai as far as possible.

I am delighted to inform you that the first issue of Library eBulletin won the consolation prize in the Online competition 'Proud to be a Librarian' under the category 'Inventor' organized by Bharat College of Arts and Commerce, Badlapur on Librarians Day, 12 August 2020.

Mrs. Ligimol Benny, Librarian has successfully completed three courses from coursera. The Librarian and Library staff attended various online Webinars and workshops during the current academic year.

SECOND FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The Western India Regional Council (WIRC) of ICAI, has jointly organised a second Faculty Development Programme in association with The Board of Studies in Accountancy, Mumbai University, The Hyderabad Sindh National Collegiate (HSNC) University, The International Accounting Association (IAA) and Smt. MMK College of Commerce and Economics. The Faculty Development Programme is a continuation of the series of programmes to be conducted for the benefit of academia and professionals in the subject of accountancy across India. The programme is held on a virtual platform on 21st May 2021 between 10 am to 1 pm. It covered topics such as Accounting Standards for Non-Corporate Entities, Accounting of Co-Operative Societies, Pandemic Pedagogy – Improvising our practices of Teaching.

CA Arpit Kabra Secretary, WIRC introduced the FDP and anchored the programme initially which was taken up by CA Shrabani Kapoor of WIRC in the later half.

Principal Dr. CA Kishore S. Peshori, Smt. MMK College of Commerce and Economics, in his inaugural address emphasised on the need to upgrade the knowledge of teaching faculty and the importance of focussing on education-based research. He hailed the efforts of CA Manish Gadia in providing a platform and bringing all the aforementioned institutions together for the benefit of faculty and students. He emphasised that the subject of accountancy and audit is dynamic, incorporating latest technologies and developments, necessitating the need to upgrade and update the subject knowledge. He mentioned the train and learn programme, which goes by the acronym "tel" initiated by ICAI. It enhances student employability and recommended that it should be promoted by the BOS and IAA.

CA Manish Gadia, Chairman, WIRC expressed the intent to tie up with various educational institutions to provide career counselling services, enter into MOUs with Universities and autonomous colleges to help in designing curriculum, setting up accountancy museums. He explained about the "tel" programme which is devised for the benefit of commerce students. The programme aims to provide practical knowledge, training, internships and experience to students of various undergraduate courses in aided and unaided streams. It covers subjects such as excel, tally, GST, Income tax, of 36 hours duration and is kept affordable. He asked the participants to promote the course in their respective colleges.

The first session on "Online teaching and learning pedagogy" by prof. Prem Chandrani, professor in strategy and finance, SP Jain Institute of Management and Research, shared his experience in conducting online teaching and gave suggestions on how to make it more effective. His session covered topics such as various challenges faced by faculty and students in online teaching and learning. Becoming familiar with the features of online platforms, using the concept of break out rooms, asking questions periodically, using animated texts, case studies, using various online tools would help in making online sessions more engrossing for the students.

Speaker CA Vishal P. Doshi took up the session on "Accounting Standards for Non-Company Entities". He explained about the accounting standards which are applicable to various non-corporate entities such as Individual, HUF, Proprietorship, Partnership, Private and Public Trusts, Association of Persons and Cooperatives. He explained the regulations relating to the applicability of accounting standards, covered key amendments and disclosure requirements.

Speaker CA Amit Mohare on "Accounting of Co-Operative Societies", explained the principles of co-operation, types of cooperative societies, definition, reasons for the failure of co-operatives in the country, focus on constitutional amendment act, rules and regulations applicable to the state of Maharashtra, important accounting and tax provisions applicable.

The programme concluded with a vote of thanks by CA Yogesh Prasade, HOD, Joshi Bedekar College. He appreciated the efforts taken by WIRC in conducting such programmes for improving the knowledge and skills of teaching faculty and expressed hope that many more joint initiatives might be undertaken in future.


17) Holi Celebrations through virtual mode (28th March, 2021)

As someone who had experienced penury, ravenousness, abuse and abandonment at the most vital pedestals of life, I was no stranger to facing new challenges and thought I had seen the worst side of the world at an early age. Nothing could surprise me anymore. To my shocking dismay-I could not have been more wrong.

At the end of March, the corona virus pandemic hit the world like a giant hurricane and altered the ways of our lives forever. Jobs lost and families left to hunger. Nature had finally waged a war to avenge the way we treated mother Earth. Ironic, isn't it? My family was drastically affected by this. Father was debilitated from toiling away at the fragments of jobs he could find. Mother and I spent the day knitting scarves to sell and making a meal; using just enough to not finish the ration we had stored for the week. Had it not been for the kind volunteers at 'Aarohi: Help for all', we would not have even made it through one week of the pandemic.

They are a group of sympathetic strangers who manage to get enough donations to provide ration for thirty families in the vicinity. The group was in fact started by a bright, well-mannered teenager named Vriddhi Kithany. She managed to convince the elders of her family to contribute to the group and now it has gained a lot of popularity in addition to saving the lives of her fellow neighbors. Vriddhi eventually became one of my closest friends and I'm utterly grateful to have her in my life. Some people are truly like a beacon of light in a time of darkness.

My favorite part of the day was attending online classes. I had used up all the savings I had from working day and night at tea stalls and selling scarves to purchase a mobile phone. I loved learning. Compared to other kids, I always went to school solely for the joy of learning and not to achieve the highest grade. From learning about the Pythagoras theorem to marveling at Atticus Finch's approach to life, I was always fascinated by the knowledge bestowed upon me and I was always keen to learn more. The ridiculous shambles of the lockdown could not chain me from seeking the education I so longed for. Apart from reading my e-textbooks and guides for school I managed to borrow a few books from Vriddhi. For nights on I was mesmerized by the adventurous tales of Harry Potter and the wondrous biographies of eminent leaders like Nelson Mandela.

I hope to be a writer someday. Through my stories I want to inspire millions of girls around the world that no matter what situation they are in there is always a chance of a better tomorrow; only if you dare to dream. If I, a daughter of a migrant worker living in the mean, suburban streets of magisterial Mumbai can get an education through a five by three inch screen, you can do anything.

MY LOCKDOWN STORY

It was late evening, when I finished my assignment which was given in an online lecture and went to the balcony with a cup of coffee. The sky was becoming dark and all the birds were resting in their nest, reminding me about how we humans spend day and night working and returning home at night to our dear ones. However, now we are all at home due to the outbreak of covid 19. It was 24th March 2020 when the first lockdown was announced. I was in Wai at that time. And had to remain there for sometime as the transportation was shut down. Every year my brother and I visit Wai, a town in the outskirts of Maharashtra. Even this year we went to collect sacks of wheat from our farm, but we couldn't return. At first, it was very difficult to adapt to this situation, but later we got used to it.

Lockdown gave me a chance to explore myself and to enhance my artistic skills. I used to paint landscape, nature and all that which I couldn't complete during my college days. Spending time with my family also gave me great pleasure. In the morning I used to read books on topics such as achieving a goal, never lose hope, etc. At night we used to enjoy old albums, or life in my grandmother's age.

But lockdown gave more stress than pleasure. In mid April, I got a call that my father lost his job, so we had to return but still the transportation was not resumed. Every day we used to find ways and wish we could return to our home, just like how labourers and migrant workers were wishing to return to their dear ones. At last, at summer's end, transportation was allowed for migrants. Special trains with precautionary measures were started.

Finally, we returned to Mumbai. It was very tough to run a family without sufficient income. Still there are many houses in which there are weak or diagnosed member, their medical cost was also a challenge and burden. On the other hand, children, their expenditure was also increasing day by day, such as electronic devices for online lecture, books and so on. Many businesses were shut, many employees were removed, some change their line of business, many people started making mask. Even in our society, people started selling mask, but couldn't sell much. So, I came up with an idea. I organized an online meeting for my society. In meeting, many problems were discussed out of which some were high electricity bill, loss of business, etc. After hearing to all the problems, I gave an explanation about how the electricity bill was increasing. I explained them that one reason is high usage of electronic devices due to lockdown, usage of air coolers, fan etc. I even requested them to reduce the use of plastic, and try to reduce pollution because it is the reason why we are using air conditioners aggressively. Coronavirus waste has become a new form of pollution as single-use personal protective equipment (PPE) floods our oceans such as masks, gloves, hand sanitizer bottles and other waste. But I feel, we all can overcome this situation easily by following simple precautions like use of sanitizers, wearing a mask, and social distancing. We are not only the one who are facing this painful period, even

our previous generations faced many incidents like partition, world war, year of great depression etc. Even they survived and overcame, so why can't we. Let's even assume, covid 19 is the most dangerous virus, but if you are following precautions, you are keeping your immune system strong, then what is Corona in front of us? ATMANIRBHAR BHARAT – RESURGENT INDIA

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's emphasis on Self-reliant India is Swadeshi economics in other words. In Indian context self reliance should not mean boycotting international trade. India will have to seriously engage with the region and the world but at the same time strengthen its own domestic industry by streamlining the governance system and go far beyond mere amendments and announcements. Gandhiji's Swadeshi movement and self-reliance were two sides of the same coin that would find currency in a globalised world. The global pandemic shows us the benefits of 'Be Indian and Buy Indian' which means that we have to be aware of our own supply chain. We know that relying on different countries for various items will not make us independent but dependent on those countries. There are underlying issues like **Weak manufacturing**: India is far behind from its target of achieving manufacturing sector contribution of 25% of the GDP. It is vital to become competitive in pursuance of self-reliance. Being vocal for locals is a key complement of Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan. In this context, people must internalize the concept of valuing local products and artefacts and promoting them. Only after this the dream of transforming 'Local' India into 'Global' India will be possible. Obviously, a Self-reliant campaign and relief packaging puts bold reforms and momentum at the heart of Government's plan to make India a self-sustaining economy so that any other crisis that may emerge in future could be efficiently tackled and will have to make major course changes in developing strategies.

ELECTRIC VEHICLES - A SOLUTION TO GLOBAL POLLUTION

Introduced in the 1800s by a British inventor, Robert Anderson, who developed the first crude electric carriage, electric vehicles (EVs) are seeing a rise in popularity today for many of the same reasons they were first popular.

A major cause of air pollution in the world is the high number of traditional motor vehicles. These vehicles run on petrol/ diesel thus emitting gases like carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxide and hydrocarbons. Air pollution then leads to health problems like asthma, heart diseases, lung cancer and even death!

Unlike traditional motor vehicles, EVs do not run-on petrol/diesel. Thus, they do not emit any air pollutants. EVs are the solution to combat climate change as they reduce emissions that contribute to it. As EVs are mechanically simpler, there is a decrease in the use and disposal of engine oil, thus improving public health and reducing ecological damage. Charging EVs on renewable energy such as solar or wind energy further minimizes these emissions. Some studies prove that if all cars were electric, 40% of total carbon emissions would be saved.

EVs make less noise too. Use of them ensures a cleaner and quieter world thus improving the quality of life. Other advantages of EVs are low maintenance, convenience, savings, etc.

EVs are the key to reducing our reliance on fossil fuels as they shift consumption away from imported oil to locally manufactured electricity sources. By using EVs, we could reduce our dependence on foreign oil by around 50-60 % while decreasing carbon pollution from the transportation sector by as much as 20%.

Thus, EVs are more eco-friendly and their use seems to be a solution to global pollution. In conclusion, if we want to safeguard our environment for future generations, we must choose EVs over traditional vehicles.

The difference between traditional and online education is especially noticeable in three dimensions: access to learning, classroom space, and the possibility of implementing innovative teaching practices. One of the major characteristics of online education is flexibility; the ability to take classes in any place with an internet connection at any time of the day or night. Traditional classes, on the contrary, are inflexible and much more teacher-centered. Access to information is not limited to materials available in the classroom, and access to the classroom materials is no longer limited to the time of the lesson or to the physical classroom space. Being able to study when and where you like affords students from all walks of life with the

availability of obtaining a degree. Whether the student is a young mother who is unable to attend traditional courses due to a lack of a babysitter, or a full-time worker who cannot rearrange their schedule to make the traditional class times, these individuals will be able to obtain a degree regardless of that situation by simply taking online courses. The flexibility offered by the online education gives particular categories of students an important opportunity to meet their educational needs.

On the other hand, the advantage of traditional courses consists in offering students direct contact with teachers. Face to face communication allows students to ask questions concerning their classes and immediately get the answers they seek. Students are also able to meet with their classmates, developing friendships and fostering teamwork. Indeed, learning in front of the PC may not be compared to the charm of going to lectures, living in the campus and visiting student parties, however, all of this has little to do with academic performance. The proponents of online learning argue that the latter offers students more time for digesting the information they receive and responding. They also claim that, while attending distance courses, students are able to better develop the skills needed in conducting open discussions, where each of the students receives more of an equal standing in comparison with a face-to-face discussion. This happens due to the fact that online students can make their responses around the clock with no restrictions, which enhances motivation and involvement on the learner's part. Also, online classes provide easy access to peers all over the world, which facilitates the establishment of a scholar network for the intellectual exchange and collaboration purposes.

The second significant difference between online and onsite education is classroom space. The very concept of online learning has facilitated the invention of another, more suitable term – learning space. Usually, faculty is free to choose between several online applications to encourage interaction through synchronous or asynchronous methods. Such methods work to extend class discussions, offering students the ability to delve deeper into a specific topic, affording students the opportunity to discuss a reading or build off of a lecture.

The third significant difference between the two reviewed educational methodologies is the application of the new online teaching practices considered to be unusual for traditional education. Online learning strategies are known to involve innovative pedagogical technologies that greatly facilitate the process of learning. Collaboration and discussion in a group were limited by classroom space, restricted to a standard lesson time and to the opportunity of being heard and seen in the classroom. Acquisition of these practices by the online education programs has turned them into an efficient and fascinating way of learning.

It is possible to see that there are different benefits to both the traditional education and the online education offered to students in this day and age. There are some individuals who are unable to work without direct classroom instruction; they are auditory learners, not visual ones, and for them the traditional classroom will be the place in which they are able to shine. Other students are visual learners, finding the traditional classroom tedious and boring, with the auditory lectures a waste of time as they have already read all of the material covered in the lecture. While it cannot be stated that one method is better or worse than the other, it can be stated that one method will be better for some students than it will be for others, allowing college students to get the most out of their college experience and providing them with the availability to do it their own way.

CENSORSHIP OF INTERNET

However, of all its positive aspects the internet has a dark, negative and an ugly side too. Internet censorship has been a hat topic in recent years because many government organizations have been trying to pass many reforms to help push the censorship of the internet either directly or indirectly - Internet censorship is the control or suppression of what can be accessed viewed or published on the Internet enacted by regulators Individuals and organizations may engage in self-censorship for moral, religious con business reasons to conform to Societal norms due to intimidation or out of fear of legal or other consequences. The extent of internet Censorship varies, on a country-to-country basis.

The question that arises is why there is a need for internet Censorship? Internet censorship can be a protection measure. As the internet is open and comprehensive the quality and authority of internet information is questionable. There are a lot of undue materials online, such as pornography and violence,

which undoubtedly exerts a negative influence on people especially children physically emotionally and also psychologically - Although there are several laws which regulate the illegal information and illegal activities, the laws are not complete enough to regulate all the illegal and immoral activities. It is very difficult to charge a person for internet crimes, especially if the person is from a foreign website. Thus, internet Censorship is needed for internet Regulation. The Censorship can cleanse the internet information and protect people to some extent

Furthermore, the censorship of internet can filler the inappropriate information online and protect children from disturbing websites such as, child pornography sexual violence and detailed instructions in crime or drug use. These undue websites are easy to severely affect the healthy growth of children or even cause adolescent Crime. Also, some terrorist organizations also use the internet to influence the thinking and mindset of children and the youth, especially young teenage boys, to join and become terrorists of such organizations in the name of religion. They might also ask other citizens for donations of money by brainwashing them and try to convince them to transfer money into their accounts.

Broadly speaking there are several motives or rationales for internet filtering such as politics and power examples include: political blogs and websites social norms and morals like these sites which include hate speech inciting racism, sexism, homophobia, islamophobia ete sites that promotes drugs prostitution and pornographic sites including child pornography, gambling sites, sites that promote video terrorism, sites promoting illegal or Criminal activities other defamatory and blasphemous content containing sites.

A country may also censor the internet for Security Concerns for protecting existing economic interests and copyright last but not the least to safeguard data information about individuals.

Circumvention is another problem faced. Internet censorship circumvention is the process used by technologically Savvy internet users to bypass or break the technical aspects of Internet filtering and gain access to the otherwise censored or blocked material. You can say that it is almost similar to hacking. Circumvention is an inherent problem for those wishing to Censor the Internet because [filtering and blacking do not remove Content from the Internet, but instead black access to it. Therefore, as long as therethere is at least one publicly accessible uncensored system, it will often be possible to gain access to the otherwise Censored material. However, circumvention may not be possible by non-tech savvy users so blocking and filtering remains an effective means of censoring the internet access of a large number of users. Also, there are risks for such tech savvy users to use circumvention Software or other methods to bypass internet Censorship

Talking about various Internet censorship methods, the general content suppression methods are technical and non technical modes of censorship and also Censorship of users by web service providers or operators Technical censorship is used by various parties for providing public access to undesirable resources with varying levels of effectiveness and side effects. Blacklisting and paints of control method is included in technical Censorship method. It also includes the Approaches Method which indices Internet Protocol (IP) Address blocking Domain name system CONS) filtering and redirection URL Filtering Packet filtering Connection reset Network disconnection Computer network hacks etc. Over and under blocking and use of Commercial filtering software are also other technical methods. The second method is the non-technical method Internet content is also subject to censorship method similar to those used with more traditional media. For example, laws and regulations prohibiting various contents publishers and authors formal or informal requests to remove or alter content in any website con webpage will lawsuits confiscation of equipments boycotting for banning government intervention et

Lastly, Web service providers or cooperators may censor the internet. They may opt for removal of user accounts based on controversial content Deplatforming is a form of Internet Censorship in which controversial speakers or speech are suspended banned or otherwise shut down by social media platforms and other service providers. Official statements regarding site and content removal are another method which is man-technical It involves prior notice for content removal for ether reasons on platforms such as Facebook Google, Youtube, Twitter.

In conclusion, the censorship of the internet is a double-edged sword. The censorship can work in same instances, but in others it can be detrimental and harmful to society. It might violate people's right of free speech. It limits people to get enough information to fulfill research and study and thus the creativity of people may be discouraged

Thus, internet Censorship must be supervised as we cannot ignore the other evil effects of internet - Although we must be grateful to the internet and technology that has helped us immensely during the tough times of Covid - 19 pandemic Internet helped us in online banking, online and virtual classes, online conferences /meetings and video calls, entertainment, etc during the pandemic and is continuing to do so.

- 1. Mobilization of saving: Stock market is organized and regulated market which protects the interest of investors. It encourages small and big investor to invest in securities through the stock exchange.
- 2. Capital formation: Investor in securities is attracted due to Good return on investment and capital appreciation. It attract more investor to invest through stock exchange corporate too can easily raise fund by offering various types of securities to meet the need of different types of investors.
- 3. Protect investor interest: All the transaction in the stock exchange are affected and controlled by securities control (regulation) act 1956. The stock exchange protects the interest of investors through strict enforcement of their rule and of regulation.
- 4. Economic barometer: Stock exchange serves as reliable barometers of a country's economic status. Stock exchange support and promote industrial development.

5. Liquidity: - It is stock exchange that provides liquidity to private investment in corporate enterprise. It provides marketability along with Liquidity to the product called securities. The facility of stock Exchange provide a two way outlet it transform money into Investment and vice versa without much delay.

There are two most important stock exchanges in India are:-

- 1. Bombay Stock Exchange Bombay Stock Exchange was set up in 1875 at that time it was called native share and stock broker association. It is Asia's first stock exchange which located in Dalal Street in Mumbai. It is the eleventh largest stock exchange in the world in term of market capitalization. It has largest number of companies listed with 5000 companies are listed in Bombay Stock Exchange.
- 2. National Stock Exchange: National Stock Exchange was setup by group of leading Indian financial institution in 1992 as a company and was recognized as stock exchange in 1993 under Securities Contract Regulation Act 1956. National Stock Exchange is located in Mumbai. It was first demutualized electronic in India.

Important form related to stock exchange: -

- 1.Broker: He is a member of the stock exchange who is licensed by stock exchange to buy or sell share on his client behalf. He is an agent between investors and jobbers. His income is in the form of brokerage.
- 2. Jobber: A Jobber is a dealer in stock exchange who carries on trading of securities in own name. He is a professional speculator in stock exchange.
- 3. Bear (mandiwala): A speculator who expect falls in price of security. He buys at a lesser price and sells at a little higher price.
- 4. Bull (tejiwala): A speculator who expects the price of particular share to rise in future and speculates with hope of selling them at higher price to earn profit.
- 5. Stag: A stag is member who buys new issues of securities from primary market and sells them at higher price when the securities are listed on stock exchange.
- 6. Nifty: It is the index of the National Stock Exchange. It is made up of so listed companies. It includes all 30 Sensex stock · It was created in 1996.
- 7. Trading ring: The trading or auction of share take place on the floor of the stock exchange which is also known as a trading ring. Trading takes place during trading hours.
- 8. Sensex: It is an index of Bombay Stock Exchange which represents increase and decrease in price of stock of selected group of companies. It was created in 1986. Sensitive index called as Sensex is made up of 30 largest and actively traded stock of listed companies.
