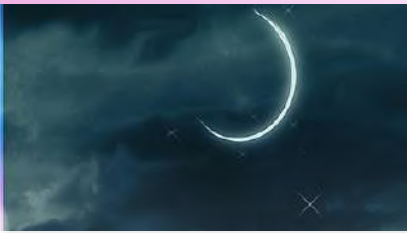

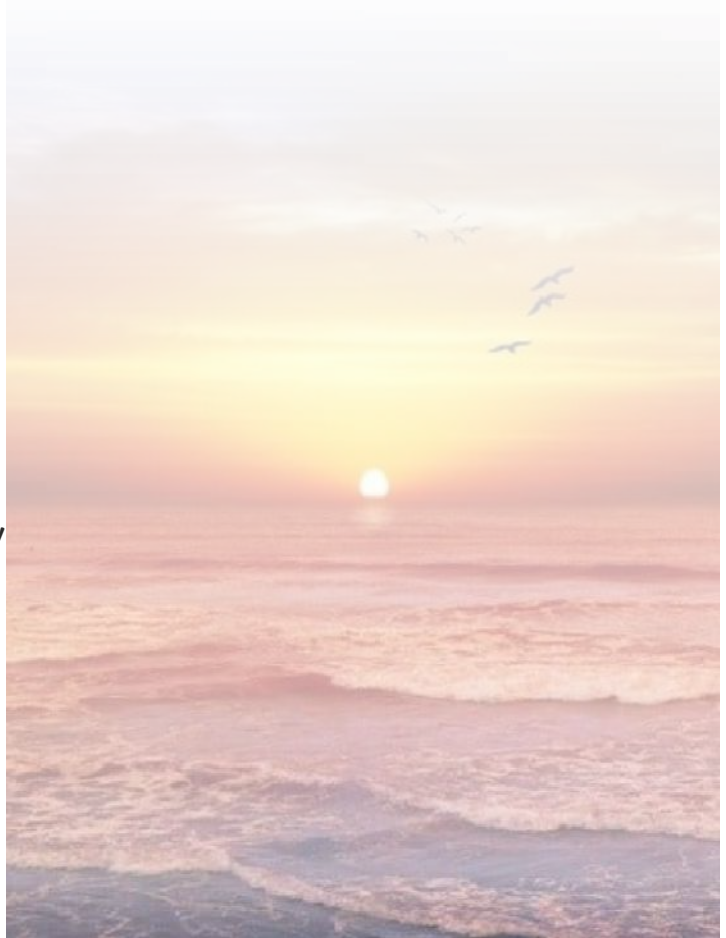

नशा सेहत के लिए बहुत हानिकारक होता है। नशा इंसान को अंदर से खोखला कर देता है। इसमें युवा वर्ग सबसे आगे है। आजकल युवा वर्ग पाश्चात्य संस्कृति अपनाना पसंद करते हैं। पाश्चात्य संस्कृति में नशे को सामाजिक रूप से अपनाया गया है। पाश्चात संस्कृति के लोग खुलेआम नशा करते हैं। हमारे देश में शिक्षित लोग भी आजकल नशा करना शान मानते हैं। नशा कई प्रकार के होते हैं – अफीम, ड्रग्स, गांजा, हेरोइन, शराब, चरस आदि मुख्य रूप से हैं। आजकल युवा पीढ़ी नशे की दवाइयाँ भी लेने लगी है। नशा एक बुरी लत एकबार लग जाती है तो हम उसमें दलदल की तरह धँसते जाते हैं। नशा शरीर को नष्ट कर देता है। नशा

करने में तमिलनाडु और पंजाब देश आगे हैं। हमारे भारतीय सेना में अधिकतर सैनिक पंजाब से ही आते थे। लेकिन पिछले सालों में युवाओं में बढ़ती नशाखोरी के कारण सैनिकों की संख्या कम होती जा रही है। 'नशा नाश है'। नशे से कई घर तथा जीवन बर्बाद होतें जा रहे हैं।

(अ) नशाखोरी फैलने के कारण –

१. तनाव होने के कारण – अक्सर परिवार में झगड़े होने तथा काम की समस्या आदि आपसी तनावों के कारण लोग नशा करने लगते हैं। युवा परीक्षा में कम अंक तथा फेल होने के तनाव से नशा करने लगते हैं।
२. सिनेमा के प्रभाव – सिनेमा में दिखाए जानेवाले चलचित्रों में अभिनेता शराब, सिगरेट, गुटखा आदि का सेवन करते हुए दिखते हैं। इससे युवा तथा बच्चे भी प्रभावित होकर नशे का सेवन करने लगते हैं। चलचित्रों में गलफ़ेंड के छोड़ जाने पर अभिनेता शराब पीने लगता है। युवा भी प्रभावित होकर देवदास बन जाते हैं। सरकार को विज्ञापन अथवा चलचित्रों में दिखाए जानेवाले नशे को बंद कर देना चाहिए।
३. पाश्चात्य संस्कृति – आजकल के युवा, बच्चे तथा महिलाएँ पाश्चात्य संस्कृति में बड़ी रुचि रखती हैं। पाश्चात्य संस्कृति में नशा करना आम बात है। इसलिए पाश्चात्य संस्कृति अपनाने के लिए ये लोग नशा करना पसंद करते हैं।
४. मॉडर्न बनने के लिए - युवा वर्ग को लगता है नशा करना एक फैशन है। युवा वर्ग में लड़कियाँ भी शामिल हैं। अक्सर ये लोग आधुनिकता को अपनाने के लिए नशा को अपनी शान मानते हैं। ये लोग नहीं समझते फैशन के चक्कर में ये लोग अपने जीवन, शरीर सब कुछ नाश कर रहे हैं। आधुनिक होने का मतलब नशा नहीं होता। शिक्षा से आधुनिक बनना चाहिए। आधुनिकता में अपनी भारत माँ का सम्मान करना नहीं भूलना चाहिए।

(ब) नशाखोरी के दुष्परिणाम –

१. गरीबी – नशाखोरी के कारण इंसान अपने परिवार के ऊपर ध्यान नहीं देता। इसके कारण कई बच्चे भूखे मर जाते हैं। बच्चों को शिक्षा प्राप्त नहीं हो पाती। नशा करनेवाले इंसान को एक वक्त खाना भले ना मिले पर नशा जरूर चाहिए। बच्चों के अशिक्षित होने के कारण तथा सही ढंग से पालन-पोषण न होने के कारण देश में गरीबी आ जाती है।
२. परिवार टूट जाते हैं – नशाखोरी के कारण परिवार बर्बाद हो जाते हैं। जिससे देश भी बर्बादी की राह पर बढ़ जाता है। इंसान परिवार पर ध्यान नहीं देता। नशा करके पत्नी और बच्चों के साथ मारपीट करता है। बच्चों पर भी इसका गलत प्रभाव पड़ता है। कुछ बच्चें यही सीख कर नशे करने लग जाते हैं। जिससे जीवन बर्बाद हो जाता है।
३. बीमारियों के शिकार – नशाखोरी के कारण लोगों को फेफड़ों का रोग, गुर्दे का रोग तथा लीवर का खराब होना, कैंसर, मुँह का कैंसर आदि कई भयानक बीमारियाँ हो जाती हैं। इंसान के पागल होने की संभावना भी रहती है। पागल होकर इंसान हैवान बन जाता है जिससे जीने से अच्छा मर जाना बेहतर है ऐसी जिंदगी हो जाती है। इसके कारण कई लोग हर साल देश में मर जाते हैं। लड़कियों के नशा करने के कारण उनके बच्चों की जिंदगी भी खराब हो जाती है।
४. अपराधी बनना – नशाखोरी के कारण लोगों को होश नहीं रहता वह क्या कर रहे हैं? क्या करने जा रहे हैं? उन्हें कुछ पता नहीं होता। इसलिए वे लोग आतंकवादी बन जाते हैं। छोटे-छोटे जुर्म कब बड़े हो जाते हैं उनको होश ही नहीं रहता। इस तरह नशा हमारे देश के उज्ज्वल भविष्य को नष्ट कर देता है। युवा वर्ग हमारे देश का भविष्य है। लेकिन नशे ने उनको पकड़ा कर रखा है। जब तक वह जागृत नहीं होंगे तब तक हमारा भविष्य खतरों में है। सरकार को नशे की सारी वस्तुओं की विक्री को बंद कर देना चाहिए। नशे के खिलाफ सख्त कार्यवाही करनी चाहिए। नशे में जो पैसा हम खर्च कर रहे हो वह पौष्टिक खाद्य-पदार्थ तथा बच्चों की शिक्षा में खर्च करने चाहिए। इससे युवा तथा बच्चे स्वस्थ भी रहेंगे तथा शिक्षित भी। नशा को 'जीवन' का आधार न बनाकर प्यार को, खुशी को जीवन आधार बनाइए। हम जानकर भी नशे का सेवन करते हैं जबकि नशे की वस्तुओं में भी लिखा होता है 'नशा' सेहत के लिए हानिकारक है। फिर भी हम नशा कर रहे हैं। इसलिए आज तथा अभी से प्रण लीजिए नशा कभी नहीं करेंगे और जीवन खुशियों से भरा बानाएँगे।

The marathon started at 7:00 am in the morning. Run for Vivekananda is an Awareness Run to Promote Swami Vivekananda Teachings in Masses, Specially Youths. The "Vivekananda Youth Connect" - initiative to popularise Swami Vivekananda's message to the youth and to project him for what he is, a youth icon. There was 12 Km Vivekananda Honour Run, 5 Km Vivekananda Dream Run, 2km Walk Vivekananda Awareness Walk.

28) UNITED FOR ROAD SAFETY (16TH JANUARY 2018)

The activity started with the inauguration ceremony by PSI. Rahul from Bandra Police Station, Mr. Bhagwan Kadam from the Traffic Department and Mr. Ayaan Khokar, the Brand Ambassador of MTP. They also introduced to us the MTP app which is made for the betterment of the pedestrians and their safety. We were shown a slideshow regarding the information about the Road Safety Programme. They concluded the day by telling us how to take safety measures.

29) INDIAN STUDENTS PARLIAMENT (BHARTIYA CHHATRA SANSAD) (19TH JANUARY -21ST JANUARY 2018)

Two of our volunteers participated in this activity which was held at MIT Campus, Pune. The innovative platform Bharatiya Chhatra Sansad or BCS as it is known as, is a non-political platform to sensitize the power of youth. It is in a way a classroom that provides political coaching to nearly 10,000 students in the age group of 18-25. It provides lessons on the functioning of a democracy and encourages the students to serve the society by entering public life and assuming leadership roles. It is aimed at enhancing the roles and relevance of youth in democratic institutions like political parties, social organizations, colleges, universities and Public institutions. A number of political leaders, industrial leaders and youth icons of national and international eminence, from all walks of life provide them the context, analysis, courage, insight and perspective so that they can dream bigger, see clearer and speak louder. They raised their consciousness and intellect, so that the youth have an opinion, a point of view and most importantly, a sobering thought about - what they will do to make a difference in the nation's life.

30) REPUBLIC DAY (26TH JANUARY 2018)

The day started with the flag-hoisting followed by the National Anthem, pledge then there was a patriotic speech delivered by the Vice-Principal of the Junior College and Degree College, Mrs. Roma Wagh and Mr. Manikandan Iyer. The faculty, office staff and the volunteers were provided with refreshments.

31) SEVEN DAYS RESIDENTIAL CAMP (28TH JANUARY -3RD FEBRUARY 2018)

NSS unit of our college organized a seven days residential camp in the adopted village, Banubai Wadi, Taragaon, Panvel from 28-01-2018 to 03-02-2018. The main project for this camp was based on, Swatch Bharat Abhiyaan. The Volunteers of the NSS unit performed many other activities – awareness programmes as literacy, tree plantation, health and hygiene, construction and repairs etc. It helped the volunteers to develop a sense of discipline and devotion. As the camp is an occasion for establishing rapport with the community. The objective of the programme was to involve the village population actively in rural welfare programmes and make them see that, by their own coordinated efforts, they could live a better life.

32) WASTE MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP (7TH -8TH FEBRUARY 2018)

This activity was organised by University of Mumbai NSS Cell in collaboration with Smt. K.G Mittal College of Arts and Commerce. Two volunteers from our unit actively participated in this two day workshop. While delivering lecture on the topic, the speaker highlighted the issue that solid waste should be segregated as being biodegradable and non-biodegradable and placed into separate dustbins. Moreover, he exhorted that what they refer to as waste is a resource if properly managed. He particularly emphasized that they should make compost for recycle of the organic resources. The main objective of this session was to Create Awareness to every citizen about Waste Management And Environment and to Reduce the carbon footprint of our cities and help in reducing green house gases. And making our cities an example in waste management to be followed by rest of the world. He concluded with an appeal that conserving the environment is the need of the hour and pathway for sustainable development.

33) DISTRICT LEVEL DISASTER MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP (13TH FEBRUARY -14TH FEBRUARY 2018)

A two days workshop cum training programme on Disaster Management was held at R.D National College for volunteers of National Service Scheme (NSS). Two volunteers from our unit actively participated in this workshop. These sessions were focused on various aspects of disaster, Disaster Management Act, 2005, understanding of

disaster management act for citizens of India, its awareness and importance, types of disasters [man made & natural], post disaster precaution and activities, importance of first aid, elements of first aid, use of first aid and benefits of carrying first kit during the travel, availability of first aid kit at home/workplace was also explained. Practical sessions were about - Do & Don'ts during and after the disaster, demonstration of different rescue tools, use of these tools in different types of disasters [like flood, fire, forest fire, land slide, accident etc.], were demonstrated with the help of student volunteers. A group of students trained for such emergency situation. Precautions to be taken in helping victims, procedures to be followed after the arrival of medical team, transportation of victim to nearby medical facility and safe areas, were explained and demonstrated with the help of presentation. Essential contents of a first aid kit, effective use of kit to reduce medical complications in different disaster situations were demonstrated.

34) UNIVERSITY LEVEL CAMP (15TH FEBRUARY TO 21ST FEBRUARY 2018)

One of our volunteer got selected for the University level camp jointly organised by University NSS Cell and Phanasgaon Arts and Commerce College, District-Sindhudurg at Pombhurle, Taluka-Devgad .10 volunteers from each District were selected on the basis of their personality, capability and positivity. The activity was inaugurated by Mr. Anurudra Narkar followed by the activities such as debates and discussion on topics such as corruption, personality development, social issues, etc. Several activities were undertaken by the volunteers in the course of camp .The main theme of the camp was Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan. It also had Shramdaan ,yoga and Guest lectures by various eminent personalities from the field of NSS. It helped the volunteers to acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude towards the society, develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and practise national integration and social harmony. The activities not only exposed the students to rural life, but also made a tangible impact in the lives of the villagers.

35) RIVER MARCH (4TH MARCH 2018)

This activity was held in Dahisar at Rustomjee School ground. Our volunteers actively participated in this River March. It was a citizen's movement to work for rejuvenation of the four Rivers of Mumbai i.e Dahisar, Poisar, Oshiwara and Mithi. The 4-year-old movement resulted in state government recognising the need for an action plan for the treatment of Mumbai rivers. Thousands of Mumbaikars actively participated in the River March which also included cleanliness drive and awareness campaigns around the Dahisar river. We also witnessed the participation of Amruta Fadnavis, wife of chief minister Devendra Fadnavis who sang the 'River Anthem' song to save rivers with noted singer Sonu Nigam.

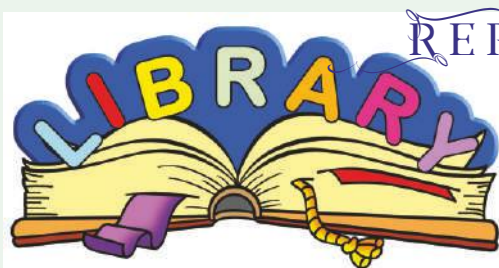

REPORT

The college library has an excellent collection of more than 49000 books and around 1000 CDs on various subjects. The Library purchased **1061** books costing **Rs.2,10,419/-** this academic year. The library subscribes to 83 Periodicals including 37 academic journals. In addition to this, the library subscribes to NLIST from INFLIBNET which allows access to more than 6000 e-journals and 31,35,000 e-books.

The Library is automated with SLIM21 standard library software and it provides Web OPAC facility. A link to Web OPAC is provided in the college website also. The college library is equipped with Bar-coding technology. The library provides internet and reprography facility to its users. The Library has institutional membership of American Center Library and the Bombay Management Association.

The library provides Book Bank facility to underprivileged B.COM students. In the current academic year 420 new textbooks costing Rs. 47680/- were added to book bank and 116 students have availed of this facility.

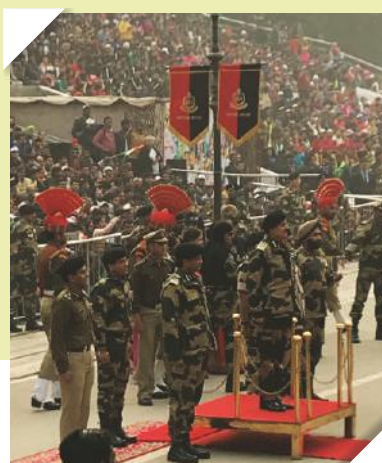

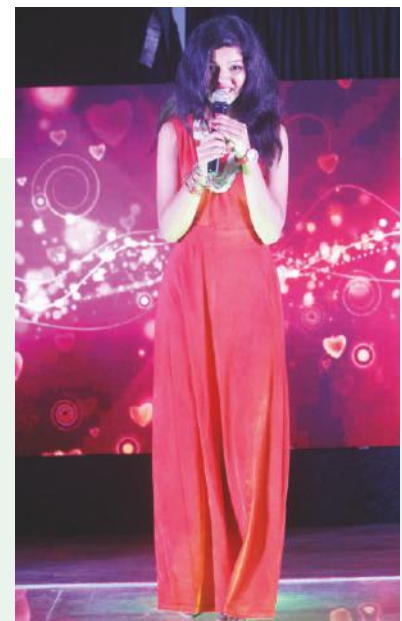

Research Center & Faculty Development Committee Report

The research center of Smt. MMK College conducted a **National level Workshop on Data Analysis "RESEARCH WEB -SERIES 1"-Understanding the Power of Excel and Convenience of SPSS**, on Saturday, 10 February 2018.

Data analysis for many researchers, corporate leaders, university faculty, and postgraduate students is a complex process. This workshop on data analysis tried to offer skills in modern data management to the participants to have a grip on research output and their analysis.

The objectives of workshop were:

- a) to provide an environment for one to one coaching on data analysis
- b) to describe data types, to-do-files, browsing and editing data, logical and statistical functions, survey data analysis
- c) descriptive statistics
- d) data graphics-histogram, scatter plots, bar plots etc.
- e) basic hypothesis testing
- f) application of appropriate test as per data type and objectives of study

Dr. Sangeeta Pawar senate member of University of Mumbai was the keynote speaker. She explained in detail the Research Methodology and how Excel and SPSS would benefit the research scholars attending the workshop.

Principal **Dr. A.C. Vanjani** welcomed the guest speaker and reiterated the institution's commitment to continue organizing such workshop for the benefit of the research scholars. Dr. Megha Somani, Chairperson Research Center, emphasized the college's role in developing research culture among the students and teaching fraternity.

The Resource person was Ms. Achita Barkhud, faculty at NMIMS, who has a wide range of experience in handling complex data analysis for multiple projects. Participants from different parts of the country attended this National Workshop. Participants were supported with desktops with installed software on SPSS and Excel with specified version on data analysis as recommended by the resource person. Participants with their own laptops were also supported with installation of required software upon arrival to the workshop by our IT Coordinator Mr. Ravi Punjabi. On 26th January Republic Day was celebrated in the college. In all, the Junior College cultural committee arranged an array of events for the students which helped them to break the monotony of the academic routine.

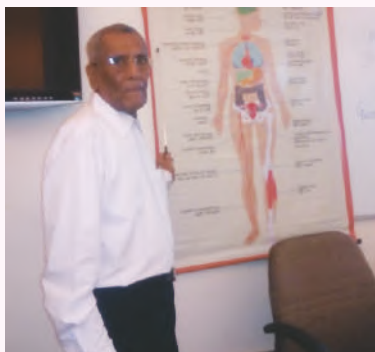
