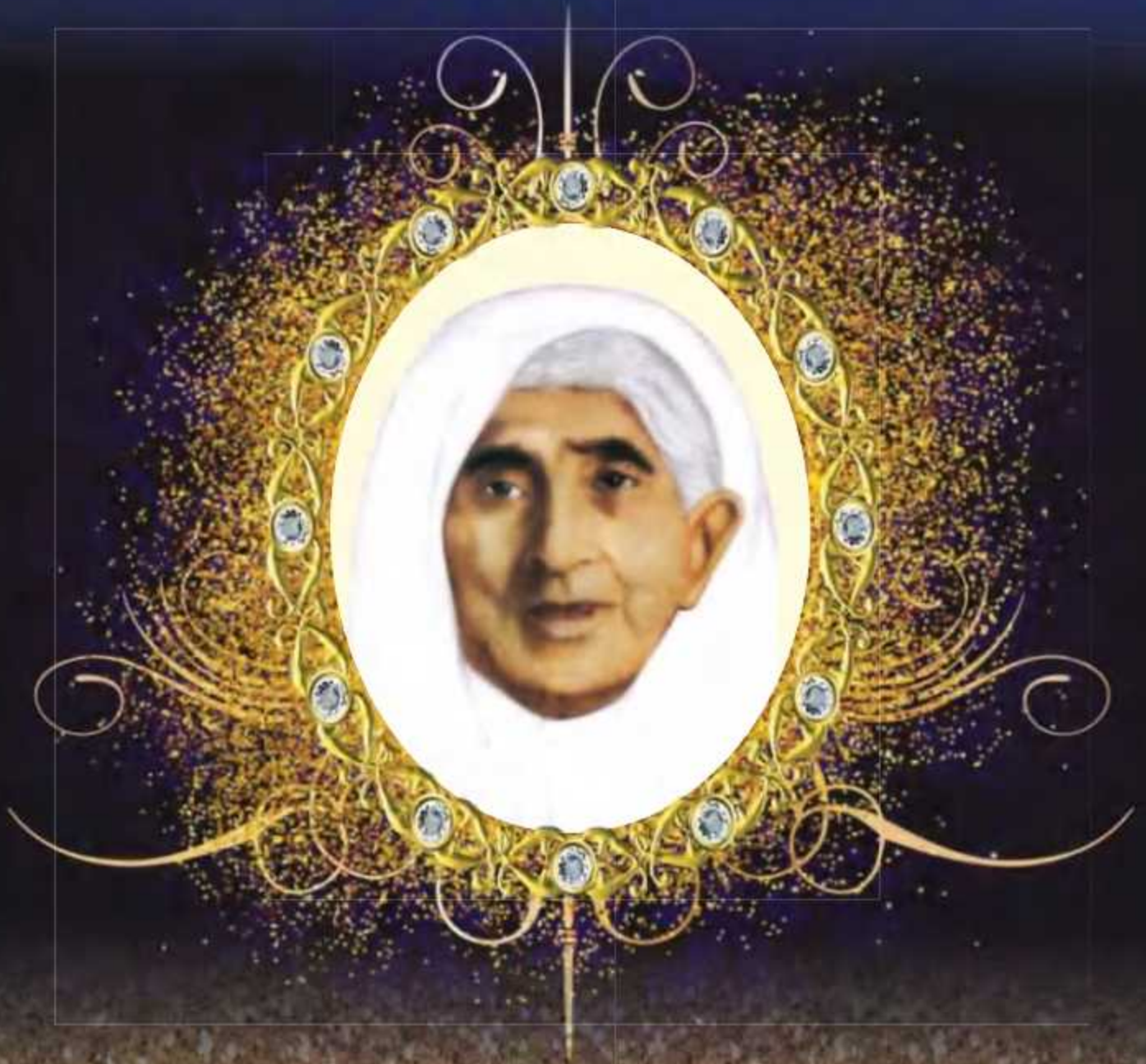

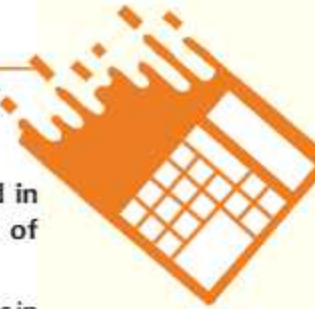

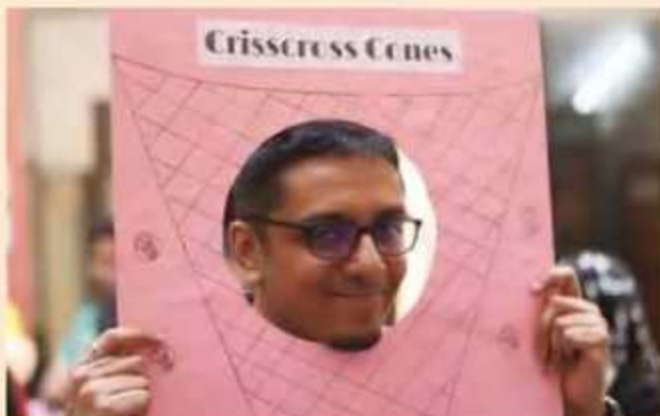

We were then explained that having direct cow's milk is harmful as it contains cancer causing agents. So, packaged milk is much better than direct milk. We were also told that there was special section in the plant for sweets.

Next we visited the cooling unit wherein the milk was cooled down before sending into packaging. We even got to see how actual butter was formed from liquid to a semi solid form. We were then provided with free samples of Nandini chaas which was actually scrumptious after which we visited the packaging unit thus, ending the walk through.

1) Development of Technical Skills

THE LIBRARY



The college library has an excellent collection of more than 50000 books on a range of subjects. The Library has acquired 733 books costing Rs.1,95,605/- this academic year. The library subscribes to 71 periodicals including e- journals. In addition to this, the library subscribes to NLIST from INFLIBNET that allows to access more than 6000 e-journals and 31,35,000 e-books.

The College Library is automated with SLIM21 standard library software and it provides Web OPAC facility. A link to Web OPAC is given on the college website also. The college library is equipped with Bar-coding technology. The library provides internet and reprography facility to its users. The Library has institutional membership of Bombay Management Association.

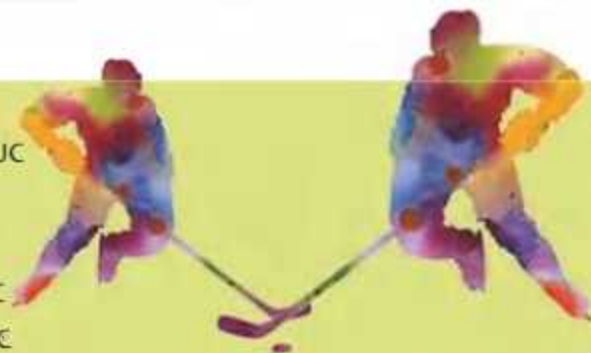

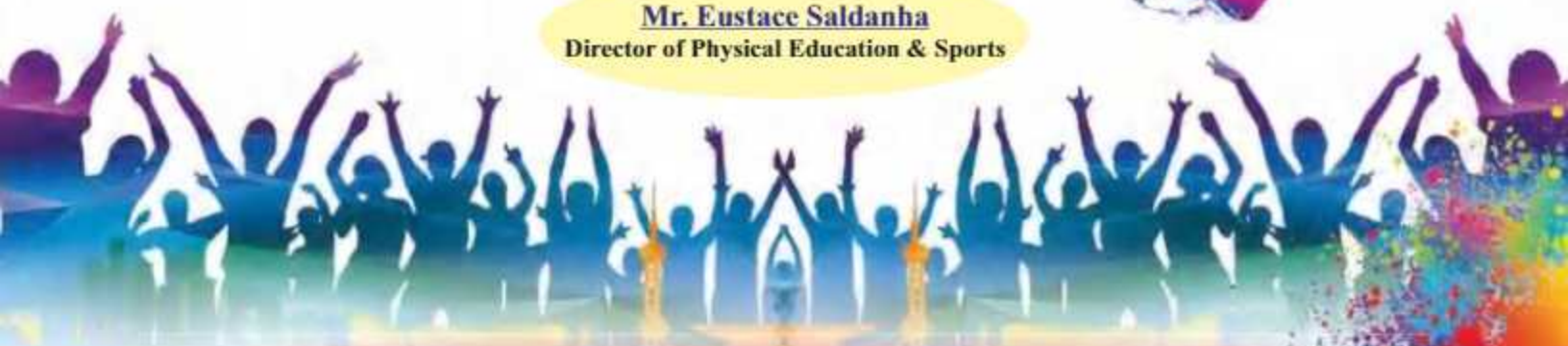

Importance of Greetings in France

Greetings :

Greetings are important in France, Thus it is necessary to greet others correctly to make a good impression. Handshakes are the norm in a business setting or with acquaintances. It is expected that you will shake hands with everyone present when arriving and leaving.

Among friends and relatives, the most common greeting is a “la bise” (kiss on both cheeks). People generally kiss twice during a 'la bise’; however this varies depending on the religion in France. One should remove their sunglasses and/or hat when doing a “la bise”.

Respect is shown in verbal greetings by referring to the person as “Madam”, “Monsieur” (Mr.) or “Mademoiselle”. In a formal setting, addressing someone by their title always precedes any conversation or request. For eg:- Madam, Would you like a drink?

Train À Grande Vitesse : TGV

The TGV is France 's intercity high-speed rail service operated by the SNCF, the State owned National Rail operator. The SNCF started working on a high speed rail network in 1966 and later presented the project to President Valéry Giscard d'Estaing who approved it.

Originally designed as turbo trains to be powered by gas turbines, TGV prototypes evolved into electric trains with the 1973 oil crisis. In 1976 the SNCF ordered 87 high speed trains from GEC-Alstom. Following the inaugural service between Paris and Lyon in 1981 on the LGV Sud-Est, the network, centered on Paris, has expanded to connect major cities across France and in neighboring countries on a combination of high speed and conventional lines.

The TGV network in France carries about 110 million passengers a year.

Bastille Day is the common name given in English speaking countries to the National Day of France, which is celebrated on the 14th July, each year. In French it is normally called “La fête Nationale” and commonly and legally i.e. 14 Juillet.

The day, 14th July commemorates the storming of the Bastille on 14th July, 1789, and the unity of the French people at the Fête de la Fédération on 14th July, 1790. Celebrations are held throughout France. The oldest and largest regular military parade in Europe is held on the morning of 14th July, on the Champs Élysées in Paris in front of the President of the Republic, along with other French officials and guests.

A popular custom on Bastille Day in Paris is going for a friendly picnic in a public park, socializing, enjoying French food and wine, before watching the fireworks from the place de la Concorde, for example. In many French Villages, people traditionally get together on July 13th to enjoy a typical Barbecue and sing and dance all night long – taking advantage of the relaxing public holiday the day after.

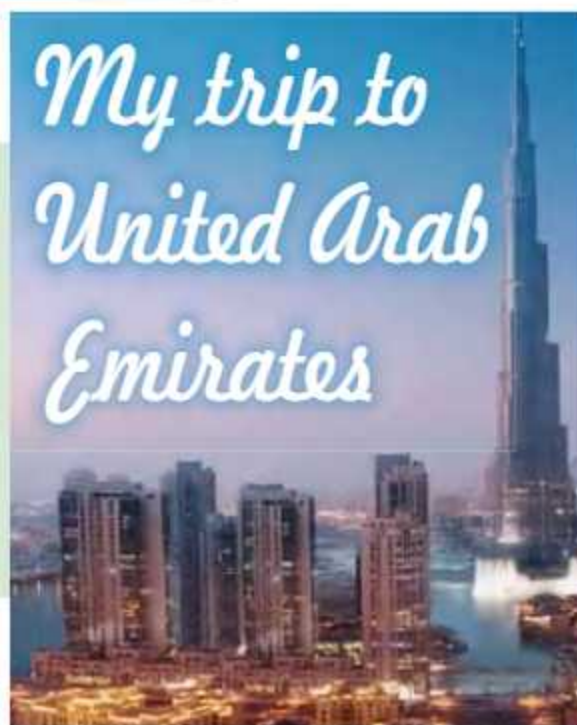

In life's seas, your gonna get drowned. I promise you can't turn it round.

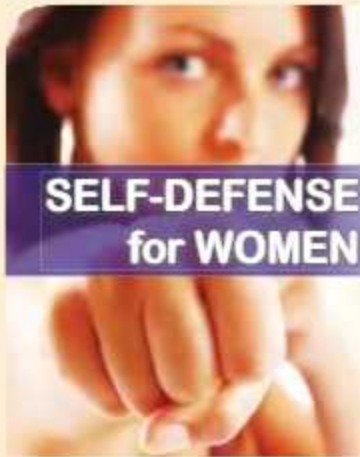
